



Voluntary Approval Scheme

By using a homebased childcare provider who is approved under this scheme parents can be reassured that the person being employed has met the minimum requirements, including an enhanced Criminal Record Check (CRC) and a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check. This scheme is designed to provide parents with a safe and secure childcare environment for their children.
